

READING ASSIGNMENT: 1 Kings 17:1.

MEMORY VERSE:

"The Lord is my rock, and my fortress, and my deliverer; my God, my strength, in whom I will trust;..." Psalm 18:2.


The woman couldn't believe it! She thought it was impossible for Elisha's promise to come true. But a year later she had a son. Oh, how she loved that little boy!


It is shown that the axe is a very heavy object and therefore we can



Elisha showed his displeasure to the king for not having manifested more enthusiasm and zeal to such an act.
